#### Constitution

The Wellington Hospital Chaplaincy Trust is a discretionary charitable trust created by Deed date 26 July 2005

Charity Registration number - CC21945

## **Statement of Purpose**

The purposes of the trust are:

- to support the provision of chaplaincy services at Wellington Hospital defined to include the Wellington Regional Hospital and Kenepuru/\_Ratonga Rua O Porirua Hospitals
- To advocate for Chaplaincy services
- To raise funds necessary to advance the purposes.

#### **Structure**

The Trust is governed by a Trust Board elected in terms of its Trust Deed. It also relies on volunteers to assist with administration and fundraising. Advocacy is undertaken by Trustees and support for chaplaincy is delivered in collaboration with The Interchurch Council for Hospital Chaplaincy Aotearoa New Zealand Charitable Trust (ICHC), and by providing grants for innovative initiatives.

## **Chairman's Report**

for year ended

31 March 2021

As we look back over the year till 31 March 2021 we could not have envisaged what would have unfurled.

At the beginning of the year the Wellington Regional Hospital was in full lockdown and the chaplains were not deemed essential workers so could not go into the hospital. The chaplains found innovative ways of being able to provide the spiritual care for the patients and staff during this difficult time. They were able to provide daily reflections for the staff, provide prayers the staff could use with the patients and spend time praying with patients over the phone. We are grateful to the chaplains for the way they adapted to be able to be there for patients and their whanau. They were called to a new way of being present to the human person in those moments of need.

The Board has continued to review the purpose of the Trust and how best we can support the chaplaincy services. One way we believe we can contribute to this is by making grants available to people who want to look at innovative ways of delivering spiritual care to the patients and their whanau and the staff who care for them. The Trust has agreed to provide grant funding to initiatives that maintain and improve the quality of these services and we look to making the first ones available in the coming financial year.

The Board has been grateful for the relationship with Norman Gray, General Manager, Medicine, Acute Flow & Emergency Services at Wellington Regional Hospital. Norman had responsibility on behalf of CCDHB for the Chaplains when they were in the hospital. Over the years he has provided insight in to how the chaplains' work is integrated into the care and well being for the patients. He has willingly given his time to working with the Trust to support the chaplaincy service. Norman retired from his role in March this year. We farewelled Norman and thank him for all that he has done to support the work of the chaplains, for his support of the Trust. He will be sorely missed by us as well as the Chaplains but we wish him well in his retirement.

A special thanks goes to Margaret Rowe and her team of volunteers for the regular stalls at the Thorndon Farmers Market. COVID 19 curtailed some of the activities over the year but the stalls continue to be well supported and it provides an opportunity to profile the Trust and more importantly the work of the chaplains.

I thank the Board for their ongoing support especially in these trying times. I especially thank Les Stephens for his work as the treasurer and his support to me personally.

As the trust grapples with what the future will be for our chaplains we continue to recognise the important contributions' they make to the well-being and welfare of those who come to hospitals for care – for the individuals themselves and for the members of their immediate and wider whanau as well as the staff of the hospital.

### **Statement of Accounting Policies**

#### For the Year ended 31 March 2021

#### **Reporting Entity**

The Wellington Hospital Chaplaincy Trust is a discretionary trust created by deed dated 26 July 2005. The financial statements of the Wellington Hospital Chaplaincy Trust are special purpose financial statements. The Trust is registered with Charities Services (CC1945)

#### **Basis of Preparation**

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of the financial performance and financial position on an historical cost basis are followed by the trust.

The trustees elected to apply Tier 4 (PBE) Public Benefit Entity Standards from 1 April 2015. This entitles the Trust to prepare financial reports on a cash basis.

### **Change in Accounting Policies**

There has been no change in accounting policies.

#### **Audit**

The Financial Statements have not been audited. The Trust deed does not require an audit of the financial statements unless required by the Charities Act or by resolution of the Trust Annual General Meeting

#### **Goods and Service Tax**

The Wellington Hospital Chaplaincy Trust is not GST registered and therefore all balances are inclusive of GST, if applicable.

#### **Income Tax**

The Trust is registered with Charities Services and is exempt from tax.

#### **Income Recognition**

All income is recognised when it is received.

#### **Investments**

Investments are stated at cost. The Trustees have reviewed the carrying value of all investments and are of the view that the carrying value of the assets are not impaired
